

## Fifth Grade Standards At A Glance 6-08

### Reading/Language Arts

- Decoding and word study, vocabulary
- Comprehension: illustration; main ideas/details; sequence; word referents
- Evaluation: purpose; fact/opinion; bias; generalizations
- Thinking skills: analyze; synthesize; visualize; summarize; predict
- Literature: characterization; story elements; figurative language; repetitions, rhythm, rhyme; reality/fantasy; myth, legend, fable; folk tale/tall tale; realistic fiction; historical fiction
- Spelling list is compiled from all the subjects taught

### Math

- Place value: addition and subtraction of whole numbers; addition and subtraction of decimals
- Multiplying whole numbers: basic facts and properties; multiples of 10, 100, 1000
- Multiply 1-2-3 digit numbers by 1-2-3 digit numbers; estimate products
- Multiplying decimals
- Dividing whole numbers: basic facts and properties; divisibility by 2, 5, 10; divide 2/3 digit number by 1 digit numbers; find 1-3 digits quotient with or without remainders; divide money; estimate quotients
- Metric measurement (dividing with decimals)
- Number theory/fractions: LCM/GCF; prime and composite numbers; equivalents; whole or mixed numbers; addition and subtraction; like and unlike denominators
- Multiplying and dividing fractions: multiply and divide whole numbers by a fractions
- Time and elapsed time
- Measurement: inches, foot, yards; length, weight; capacity
- Temperature
- Tables and schedules
- Ratio/percent
- Geometry
- Statistics/probability

- Use of reference materials
- Geography of the United States: climate/latitude/longitude; natural resources
- Regions
- First Americans: Indians of North America; Europeans come to the Americas; English colonies; colonies become a nation; building a new country (constitution and government)

- Westward expansion: Indian wars; railroad development; housing; Industrial Revolution; immigrants

### Science

- Discovering the plant and animal world: green plants; invertebrates; vertebrates; living communities
- Discovering matter and energy: building blocks of matter; physical changes in matter; electricity; sources of energy
- Discovering the Earth and the universe: changes in the Earth; cleaning up the Earth; changes in the weather
- Discovering the human body: support and movement of the body; transport systems of the body
- Personal hygiene

- God is with us in Jesus, who is the sacrament of God's presence
- All people are made in the image and likeness of God and deserving of respect and love
- Every element of creation is a sign of God's presence
- Jesus is both human and divine, teacher & prophet
- He speaks the word of God and brings us God's healing power
- Pentecost
- Sacraments are sacred signs as well as celebrations
- Sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist

### **Family Life**

- Each family is unique
- Communication and family life: differences in discussing, arguing, quarreling; counseling
- Good communication: message; medium; prayer
- Puberty: growing at your own pace; balanced diets; cleanliness and rest; feelings
- Physical fatherhood: study of male reproductive system;
- Physical motherhood: study of female reproductive system
- Caring and loving: ways in which people express love for one another; qualities of friendship; sexuality
- New life: marriage as a sacred relationship; responsibility of love
- Social living: marriage and family life fulfill important social needs; consequences of divorce on both family and society
- Stewardship- taking care of all; people are called to take care of God’s creation; differences between wants and needs

### **Music**

- Melody through listening, moving, playing, singing, reading
- Rhythm through listening, moving, playing, singing, creating and reading
- Harmony through listening, playing, singing, reading
- Form through listening, moving, playing, singing and reading
- Expression through listening, playing, singing and reading
- Style through moving and playing
- Skill: listening with increased perception to a wide variety of music; exhibits increase skill in chording with autoharp, uses notation increasingly as an aid in listening, performing and creating

### **Art**

- Manipulative skills: care of room and materials; proper clean up; ability to use and control art tools

(scissors, glue, paper, pencils, markers); listening, following directions, interpreting assignments

- Color study: study colors by name
- Design: study shapes, line, texture; use to create symmetrical compositions
- Drawing and painting; use of pencil, markers
- Sculpture: identify and create 2D and 3D forms
- Appreciation: it is important to value what is created by self and others
