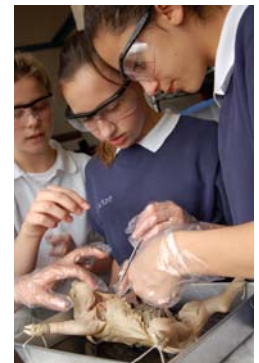

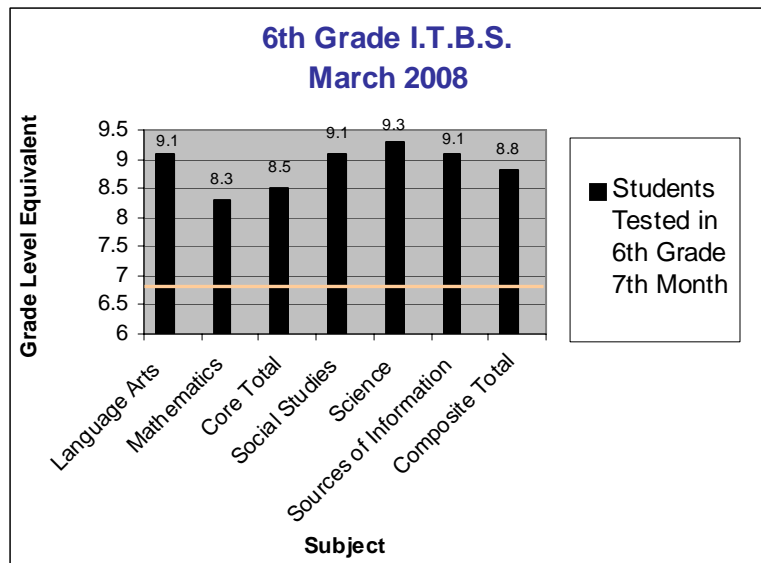
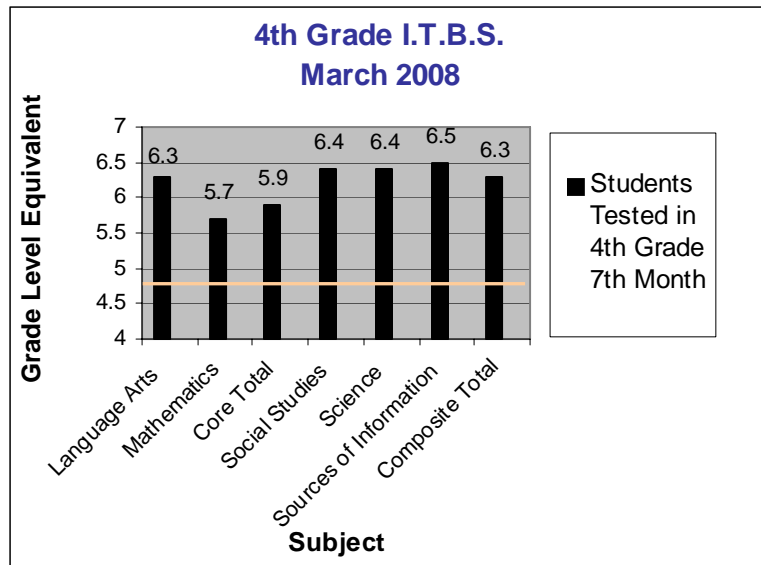
WE MEASURE UP

Iowa Tests of Basic Skills

The **Iowa Tests of Basic Skills (ITBS)** are national standardized tests administered annually in the Diocese. The tests offer one measurement of progress. While some of our schools test students at each grade level, ITBS is required for all 4th and 6th grade students. The charts below demonstrate that our students are testing significantly above grade level.



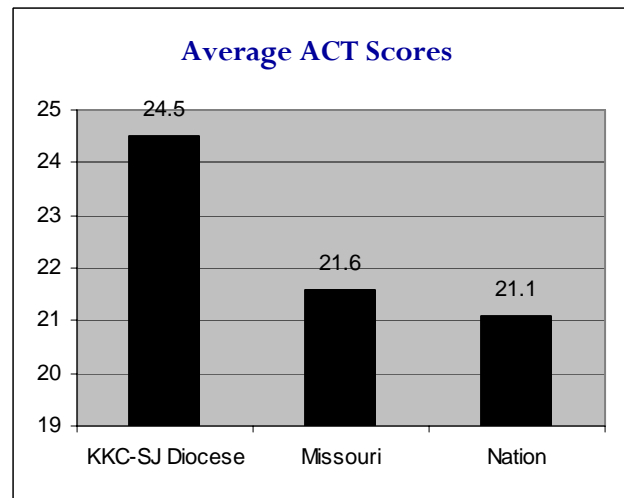
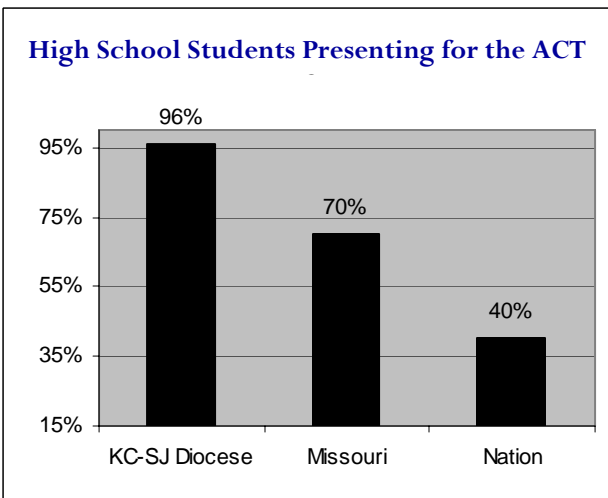

TIME PROVEN OUTCOMES

ACT

The ACT Assessment measures the general educational development of high school students. Testing outcomes are one predictor of the potential to complete college-level work. The test covers four skill areas: English, math, reading and science.



GRADUATION RATE

In our high schools, 100% of our seniors met all academic requirements and received diplomas.

Overall, in the State of Missouri the graduation rate is 86%. Across the nation, only 77% of U.S. high school seniors graduate. Our Catholic schools do not just prepare young people to make a living. Our schools prepare students to make a life.

PREPARATION FOR COLLEGE

Hats off to the Class of 2008 - 99% went on to college or university.

On average, each graduate accepted \$9,422 in

academic scholarships for their first year of college.

This does not reflect athletic scholarships or need-based financial aid. Four entered military service, and nine accepted appointments to military service academies.

As the first and primary teachers, parents turn to parishes and Catholic schools to help their children form an enduring relationship with God. Sacred events in the lives of our Catholic school students are at the core of Catholic education yesterday and today. Last year, in our school communities

- 100% began each school day with morning prayer
- 100% gave thanks before meals
- 100% of our elementary schools celebrate Mass weekly
- High school communities invite priests to visit and to celebrate Mass
- 688 second grade students celebrated First Reconciliation
- 688 second grade students celebrated First Eucharist
- 777 high school students celebrated Confirmation
- 10 high school graduates answered a vocational call in the last five years
- 100% of our students have opportunity for Reconciliation in Advent, Lent, and on average one additional time per semester
- School communities create time for Eucharistic Adoration on average twice monthly
- 42 non-Catholic students entered the church through RCIA

The mission of Catholic education is to teach children to live as Jesus taught. The tradition continues: our Catholic schools are places to learn who you are, what you can become, and how to make the world a better place.
